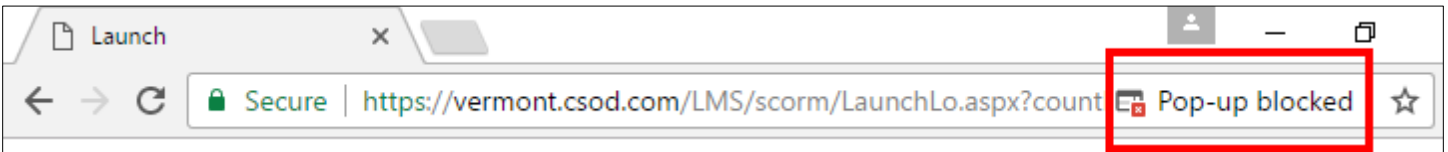


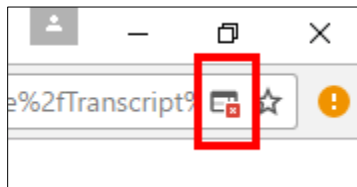
How-To Allow Pop-Ups in Chrome Browser

Your Chrome Browser is set to block pop-ups automatically, but sometimes that can interfere with opening content you actually want to see, like some of our training videos. Follow the steps below if you suspect Chrome is blocking pop-up content you want to see.

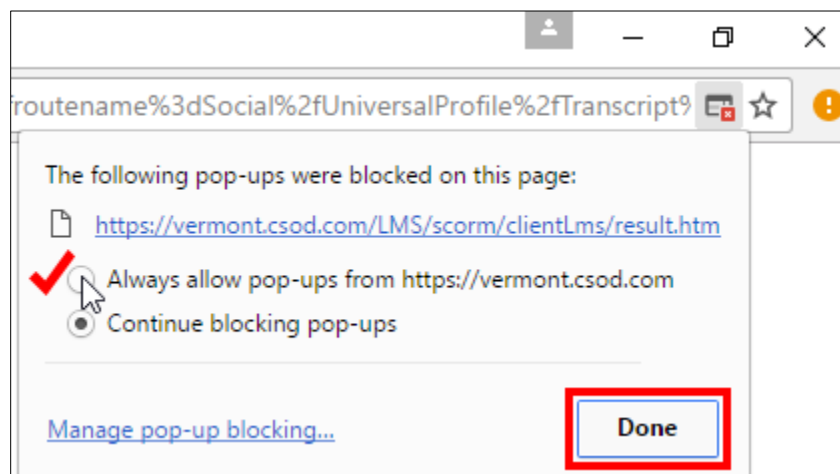
1. Look in the upper right part of the screen, at the end of the box that has the web address typed in it. If a pop-up has been blocked, you will see one of two things:
 - a. If the pop-up was just blocked, you'll see the **"Pop-up Blocked"** message and icon:



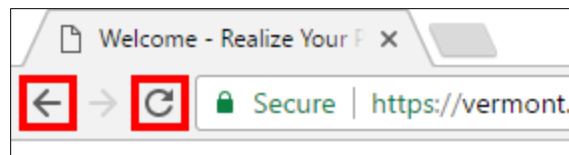
- b. If the pop-up was blocked 10 seconds or more ago, you'll see just the **icon**:



- c. Click on the message / icon to open pop-up options for the blocked content.
- d. Click the circle to **"Always allow pop-ups..."** from the website you're trying to access and then click the **"Done"** button.



- e. If nothing happens immediately, either **reload** the page by clicking the **circle-arrow button**, or **go back a page** by clicking the **left-arrow button** and then click the original link to re-launch the page.
